Aggregate

Link integrates disparate data types from across Harvard and automatically aggregates them into a unified database that is updated daily.



Process

Using advanced data engineering techniques, Link standardizes the information so that it can be cleanly searched in different categories such as news and events.

Search for things like experts, news on the latest research, or upcoming events and start finding news ways to engage with Harvard's resources and community.
